## A Bug's Eye View: Be a Bug Hero! Opens May 1 through Labor Day, 10:00 a.m.-5:30 p.m. dailv.

Explore the wonderful world of bugs at Woodland Park Zoo's new temporary exhibit, A Bug's Eye View. Enjoy this immersive experience that promises to excite and highlight the importance of pollinators and what makes many bug species the superheroes of the planet.

A Bug's Eye View will bring visitors face to face with 14 massive animatronic insects representing species from all over the world. The giant bugs include a sprawling Mexican redknee tarantula with legs extending 38 feet, an emperor scorpion with a 15-foot-high tail, a praying mantis that mimics flowers and much more! These larger-than-life animals are perfect for discovering what makes bugs superheroes and the critical role they play in everyday lives.

Tickets to A Bug's Eye View will be available at the entrance to the exhibit within the zoo. Prices do not include admission to the zoo. General admission tickets: \$5; member tickets: \$4.

## Seasonal Molbak's Butterfly Garden, opens May 27 through Labor Day, 9:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m. daily

Molbak's Butterfly Garden is a magical experience where guests of all ages, backgrounds and abilities can experience the wondrous world of "flying flowers." Stroll among hundreds of free-flying butterflies inside an enclosed space, all while surrounded by a display of beautiful flowers. Learn about the life cycle of these colorful, winged insects while watching larvae undergo a miraculous metamorphosis as they emerge as butterflies before flying. Behind the butterfly garden is the year-round Microsoft Pollinator Patio, a glorious garden complete with ideas and actions to take on behalf of native pollinators such as butterflies, hummingbirds, beetles, bees and flies.
