WHAT: Woodland Park Zoo invites guests to enjoy a StoryStroll this summer! Celebrate the little things in life with “Junebug: No Life Too Small” by Nicole Daniels and illustrated by Addy Rivera Sondo. Along the paved path by the zoo’s Molbak’s Butterfly Garden, discover each page and learn how one girl teaches her friends to be a caring and compassionate friend to all kinds of bugs! Each page will include English text, braille and a read-aloud QR code so that children and adults can discover the story while strolling by the zoo’s butterfly garden.

INFO: It’s all about bugs this summer at Woodland Park Zoo! After exploring StoryStroll, stop by the newly upgraded Bug World. From the temperate forest and desert to the savanna and tropics, Bug World unleashes the world of 16 species of arthropods. Discover the Mexican red-knee tarantula, western horse lubber, two-spotted assassin bug, Peruvian fire walking stick, emperor scorpion and many more.

And there’s more! Head over to A Bug’s Eye View, an immersive experience that promises to excite and highlight the importance of pollinators and what makes many bug species the superheroes of the planet.
