



Visit the Amazing Animals at the Zoo!

Spend a day at the nationally award-winning Woodland Park Zoo, located just 10 minutes north of downtown Seattle, Washington. This lush 92-acre urban oasis features more than 800 animals representing over 230 species from around the globe. Spot towering giraffes on the African Savanna, playful Asian small-clawed otters in Banyan Wilds and be awed by Western lowland gorillas in the Tropical Rain Forest. See orangutans swing on the Trail of Vines, majestic snow leopards in Australasia, and be charmed by our greater one-horned rhino, Glenn, in the Assam Rhino Reserve.

Woodland Park Zoo provides a home for 30 endangered, threatened, or vulnerable animal species, and participates in 98 Species Survival Plans, overseen by the Association of Zoos & Aquariums. The zoo's botanical collection includes more than 92,000 plants and trees representing more than 1,300 species.

You'll also have the opportunity to help save wildlife and wild places by making conservation a priority in your life through dozens of daily public programs, conservation projects and keeper talks.

Accredited by the Association of Zoos & Aquariums (AZA), award-winning Woodland Park Zoo is famed for pioneering naturalistic exhibits and setting international standards for zoos all over the world. Conservation, education and excellent animal care are at the core of the zoo's mission. The zoo is helping to save animals and their habitats in Washington state and around the world including tree kangaroos, snow leopards, red-crowned cranes, Western pond turtles and Oregon silverspot butterflies.
